|     | Identify interest and aptitudes Learn about the job market nationally and locally. Decide on a career/major and an alternative. Plan to start working in the area you have chosen so that you can acquire some hands-on experience. Begin developing relationships with professors, staff members, and leaders in the community. Establish role models as this is important and prove helpful especially during a crisis. Begin working on your resume. Start interviewing for internships and summer employment/attend seminars workshops, etc. |

| 0   | Get a part-time job. Try to work for businesses that are somewhat related to your major. Work on your correspondence: letters of acceptance, cover letter, etc.  Get work experience through internships, summer employment, or co-op assignments.  Participate in workshops, seminars, and all the Center's Special Events.   |

| Begin interviewing. Follow up on job ads and placement schedules.  Review the market for your career area.  Learn salary ranges.  Prepare letters of acceptance or refusal.  Maintain employer file as you interview. Keep a list of employers. Know the names of the recruiters you spoke with so that you can refer to them later.  Be positive and alert. Stress qualities about yourself.  Prepare to fall back on alternative skills. If you are not getting the job, you want soon enough, begin looking at other work that you are able to do.  Follow up on all leads and advice. Do not be afraid to ask questions. Believe in yourself. You have something to offer, so concentrate on that.  Prepare the final resume.  Take advantage of workshops, seminars, and all the Center's Special Events (i.e., Career Fair, Career Expo, Grad. & Professional Schools Day, & Educators' Day). |
